To Whom It May Concern

I have known Dr. R. G. Struzak for more than 10 years in connection with our mutual interest in the activities of the International Special Committee on Radio Interference (CISPR). Dr. Struzak has been a consistent contributor to the work of this committee in three specific ways: (1) by contributing documents of excellent technical quality relating to various subjects under discussion at the time. Included have been documents on radio interference filters, instrumentation circuits, and environmental measurements made in large cities, (2) through participation in discussions of these topics in both preparatory working group meetings and in formal procedures in subcommittees, and (3) through his organization and conduct of special seminars in electromagnetic compatibility sponsored by various concerned organizations, which were held in Wroclaw, Poland.

Also, to Dr. Struzak's credit are many papers and several books on electromagnetic compatibility of which he was not only editor, but a substantial contributor. In recent years he has been Vice-Chairman of CCIR Study Group 1, concerned with the use of the spectrum. It is obvious that Dr. Struzak is a prolific author, is capable of making very practical application of his knowledge of electromagnetic theory and he is a well respected authority in his field.

Although I have no direct evidence of Dr. Struzak's qualifications as a teacher, my experience with his presentations of technical matters and direct discussions with him have indicated to me the depth of his understanding of the scientific principles underlying his work and that of others, so that I feel sure his qualifications are excellent.
